A **BBQ** for members and dealers will take place very soon after the show closes on Sat.

## Grand Duchess of Luxembourg

This is what happens when you purchase something and are not sure what it is. In this case, I bought a postcard from Denny Peoples thinking that it showed the royal princesses of Austria.

In the center is Grand Duchess Marie Adelheid. She is surrounded by her sisters. Marie Adelheid became grand duchess in 1912, abdicated in 1919 in favor of her sister Charlotte, and died in 1924.

Grand Duchess Charlotte (standing in back) became grand duchess in 1919 and ruled until 1964 when she abdicated in favor of her son, Jean.

The other sisters are Hilda, Sophie, Antonette, and Elisabeth.

Still a pretty card, but not what I thought, and none are related directly to Queen Victoria!
